The crime(s) of Murder 2nd Degree has (have) been committed by the defendant.

The affiant's belief is based on the following facts and circumstances:

During the early morning hours of July 24th, 1997 a Hispanic male transient was wrapped in a blanket and apparently sleeping next to a grain silo behind a store at 733 S. Wenatchee Avenue in the City of Wenatchee, Chelan County, Washington.

The man, Hector Lopez Partida, was stabbed seven times by an unknown assailant at that location. Lopez Partida, managed to walk to a nearby parking lot where he collapsed. An unknown subject called "911" to report a man down. Wenatchee Police officers responded to 733 S. Wenatchee Avenue where they contacted Lopez Partida. When asked who did this to him he replied, "Gavachos (white guys)". Lopez Partida was unable to say anything else and died a few minutes later from his wounds. The coronor ruled the manner of death was a homicide (and caused by the stabbing).

Searching the crime scene, officers found a shirt 75 to 100 yards south of the attack site. The shirt appeared to be new. It had fresh blood stains on the front, outside portion of the shirt. Officers and detectives followed up on this case interviewing a number of subjects. No suspects were identified at that time.

In 2005 the Wenatchee Police Department submitted the above mentioned shirt and other evidence to the Washington State Patrol Crime Lab for DNA analysis. On January 29th, 2009 the Crime Lab reported the blood found on the outside of the shirt came from Hector Lopez Partida. A swab taken from a swatch of the shirt in the armpit area came back with a DNA match for a convicted felon named Jason E. Bush, dob 08-11-74. I spoke with Anna Ballard, the Crime Lab Technician who analyzed this shirt. She believes there is no indication that any other DNA except for the victim's and the suspect's is on the shirt.

A check of local records shows Jason Bush lived in Wenatchee from May of 1997 until he was incarcerated (in Nov/Dec 1997) and then sent to prison in

October of 1998. During that time he was cited for a misdemeanor assault in June of 1997, named as a potential suspect in an attempted arson/fire-bombing on July 21st, 1997 and was arrested for a felony assault on a fellow jail inmate in April of 1998. He was sent to prison from Wenatchee for local convictions regarding felony arrests for stolen property (Aug 97), Unlawful Possession of a Firearm 2nd Degree (Sep 97) and Taking a Motor Vehicle without Permission (Nov 97). After his release from prison in 2003 he went to Northern Idaho and lived in the Sandpoint – Hayden Lake area through 2007. I have learned Bush has had long standing ties to Aryan Nations groups that commonly believe in white superiority over other races and have been known to be violent towards non-white races. He espoused these beliefs to associates in Wenatchee in 1997.

On June 10, 2009 I learned that Bush is a potential suspect in the double homicide of a Hispanic adult male and nine year old Hispanic female in Pima County, Arizona. Bush may have also attempted to murder an adult Hispanic female in this incident that was described to me by the Pima County Sheriff's Office as a home invasion where Bush shot all three subjects.

On June 11th I spoke with a confidential informant (CI) who has known Jason Bush for over 12 years. The CI stated that in the summer or fall of 1997 Bush told him/her that he and another man killed a man because he was "a Mexican". Bush allegedly told the CI that he and the other man found the man behind a store. They stomped him, stabbed him, and left him to bleed out.

On June 11th I spoke with another confidential informant (CI No. 2). This informant has also known Bush for several years. This informant stated that Bush bragged to him/her of killing three different people in Wenatchee.

On the evening of June 11th, 2009 Bush was apprehended by law enforcement officials in Arizona for a probation violation warrant from the Chelan County Sheriff's Office in Washington State. He is currently in custody in Arizona.

NARRATIVE:

On July 24th, 1997 Hector Lopez Partida was stabbed seven times next to a grain silo located behind a store at 733 S. Wenatchee Avenue, Wenatchee, WA. Lopez Partida died as a result of this assault.

In January of 2009 The Washington State Crime Lab provided test results indicating a shirt recovered near the site of the attack contained the blood of Lopez Partida and DNA belonging to Jason E. Bush, dob: 08-11-74. A copy of the crime lab report is attached.



SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT

On June 11th, 2009 I spoke to a Confidential Informant who told me that he/she heard Jason Bush brag about killing three people in Wenatchee. On that same date I spoke to a second Confidential Informant who specifically stated that Jason Bush told him/her that he killed "a Mexican" behind a store by stomping on him, stabbing him, and leaving him to bleed out.

On the evening of June 11th Jason Bush was arrested by law enforcement officers in Arizona on a probation violation warrant issued out of Chelan County. Bush is a suspect in a double homicide that occurred on May 30th, 2009 in Pima County, Arizona.

I would request the Chelan County Prosecutor's Office issue a warrant for Jason Bush's arrest on the charge of Murder in the Second Degree concerning the death of Hector Lopez Partida. A probable cause affidavit is attached.
